

Plymouth City Council Meeting Proceedings
Thursday, November 2, 2023

The Plymouth Council met in regular session on Thursday, November 2nd, at 7:00pm.

Mayor Kuhlbers called the meeting to order with the following members present- Lissa Merfeld, Wade Eastman, Amy Berding, Allan Rye and Eric Abundis.

Others Present: Craig Howard and Denise Eastman.

Motion to approve agenda by Abundis, 2nd by Rye. Motion carried.

Comments from Council – No comments from Merfeld, Berding presented a financial report for Community Betterment, asked Wade about street flooding after the rain a couple of weeks ago. Rye commented we have an albino squirrel living South of town. Abundis feels meeting minutes should be posted in the window. Eastman said he had a phone call about the lead/copper water line survey that is due next August.
